

LEVEL 1 IN-CLASS APPRENTICESHIP TRAINING FOR ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS

District school board (DSB) OYAP recruiters are encouraged to explore the various Level 1 in-class apprenticeship training options available and determine which ones are appropriate and will be available to their students. Information on these programs must be part of the school/board course calendar.

Level 1 Curriculum Incorporated into Secondary School Curriculum

The secondary school curriculum in some senior technological education courses is specifically designed to align with the in-class training requirements of the related apprenticeship curriculum. At the end of their secondary school course, students can take the Level 1 exemption test. If they achieve 70% on this test, they will receive recognition for successful completion of Level 1 in-class training from the college that administers the exemption test. The Level 1 can be recognized by the Ministry of Labour, Immigration, Training and Skills Development (MLITSD) once the students have a registered training agreement (RTA), up to 2 years after taking the exemption test. OYAP funds can be used to pay for exemption tests.

OYAP Level 1 In-class Training at Non-College TDAs

Students may also take Level 1 training at an approved Training Delivery Agent (TDA) that is not an Ontario college. In that case, students do not earn dual credits. No funding is provided through the School College Work Initiative (SCWI). For these programs, DSBs may request in-class training funding from their local MLITSD office.

SCWI Dual Credit Programs

Students who successfully complete Level 1 dual credit programs listed below are not required to take exemption tests. Depending on the delivery approach, successful completion of these programs results in students having Level 1 recognized by MLITSD at the time of completion of the program or, at a later date, up to 2 years after completing the program, if and when they have an RTA.

Programs vary depending on the location, delivery model and the target group - OYAP students vs. students in the primary target group (PTG).

*Oversight: College signs attestation form to indicate that college has TDA status for that trade, and that secondary school has included the Level 1 in-class curriculum, has the appropriate equipment and facilities, and that the teacher has the appropriate qualifications.

MLITSD in-class training funding covers college facilities, faculty, materials, and administration and is paid directly to the college. SCWI in-class training funding covers the same items but is paid to the Regional Planning Team (RPT) which then forwards funding to the college.

With MLITSD in-class training funding only, students must have an RTA. A class is created in the EOIS-APPR by the local MLITSD office and results are recorded by the college. For all other models, students must present results from the college to MLITSD when they have an RTA.

Miscellaneous Funding Requests:

Note that supplies and texts are included in the benchmark amounts. If those amounts do not cover actual costs, additional SCWI funding can be requested in the Miscellaneous section of the proposal.

- Requests for supports for students with disabilities (e.g., Sign Language Translator, Braille textbook) where the cost cannot be borne by the board or college
- Limited funding for personal safety equipment (PPE, e.g., glasses, boots, hearing protection, uniforms) where required at the instructional location. Efforts should be made not to duplicate expenditures (i.e., OYAP funding may be used to purchase PPE required at the coop placement site; students should use this PPE for their in-class training).
